
WHERE DO YOUR MICKELS GO?



Developing Youth and Conserving Natural Resources

Conservation Corps North Bay (CCNB) has been serving the community since 1982 by providing young adults with opportunities to transform their lives through paid work, education, employability, civic engagement, and leadership. We work with local agencies and communities to conserve and restore natural resources and improve recreational and public areas and make our community safer by reducing hazards and by responding to public emergencies and disasters. Local government agencies are full of

our program alumni, allowing our young people to truly see potential career pathways.

Corpsmembers in our program earn skills and earn certifications to help in their future careers, and work toward advancement opportunities within the corps along the way. While earning a wage, young people learn how to work together and complete difficult tasks. Our empowerment-centric programming has helped more than 12,000 young people

break the cycle of poverty through education and job skills, while serving the environment and community.

Through the support services offered by CCNB, corpsmembers can learn English, earn their high school diploma, explore careers, and access critical resources for themselves and their families.

Donations to CCNB make our wraparound support services like academic coaching, interview practice, and professional development possible. Our corpsmembers are also always grateful to receive donations of clothing, home supplies, kids' toys, food, and gas cards to help them navigate day-to-day life with their families outside of CCNB.
