

WHERE DO YOUR NICKELS GO?

The Marin History Museum celebrates the traditions, innovation and creativity of the people of Marin County, and is the only history museum collecting and serving all of Marin. Through exhibitions and educational programs, MHM inspires honor for the past, an understanding of the present and an imagination of the future.

The Museum was founded in 1935 with the purpose of preserving Marin County's history after several pioneer families noticed that our history was not being safeguarded. The diverse population of multi-generational families in Marin are curious about their family roots and local history in general.

88 years later, MHM continues to be committed to the stewardship of the Collections that include over 25,000 artifacts and over 200,000 photographic images. They recently opened at the historic Boyd Gate House in downtown San Rafael, offering access to their Research Library and an exhibition space. They are dedicated to educating our community through accessible and inclusive programs including education programs for school-aged children, monthly lectures, oral history projects, tours, etc.

Check out the new exhibit opening on Saturday, August 26th entitled 1973: The Marin Countywide Plan at 50. This exciting exhibit looks back at this important Countywide plan and how it shaped the Marin we know today.
