In 1980, two visionary women, Ellen Straus and Phyllis Faber—a dairy farmer and a botanist—brought together local ranchers and conservationists to protect family farms from mounting development pressure. As a result, the Marin Agricultural Land Trust (MALT) was born—the first land trust in the nation focused on protecting farmland.

Today, MALT has safeguarded more than 55,721 acres in Marin County and invested more than \$98 million in protecting Marin farms and ranches. This protected land forms a cornerstone in our regional resilience.

MALT's mission is to permanently protect Marin's agricultural land for agricultural use.
